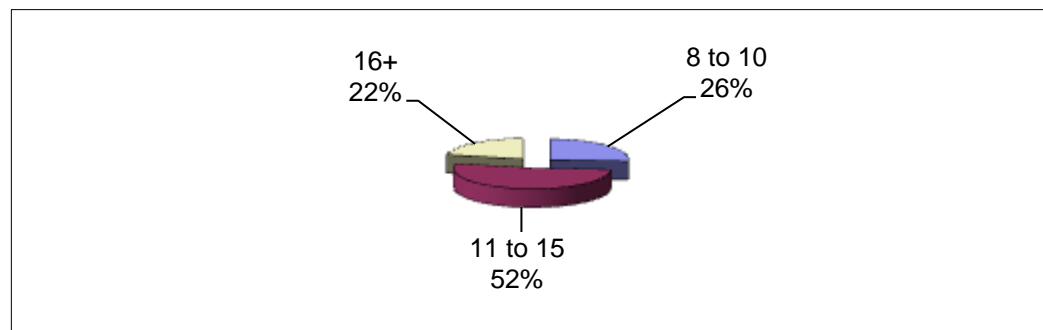

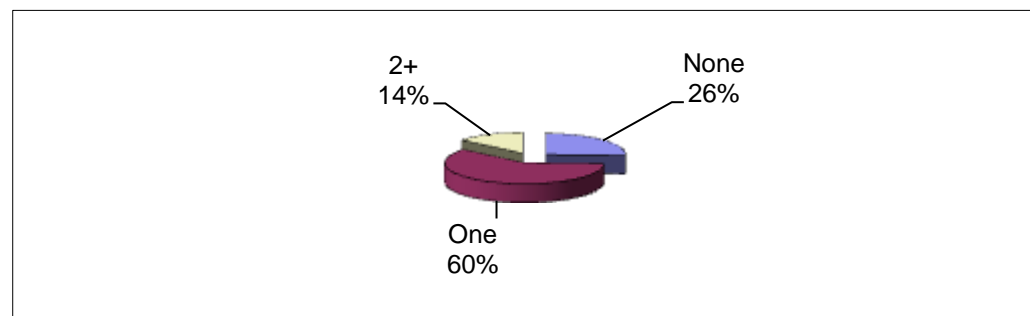
A1 - Age Range

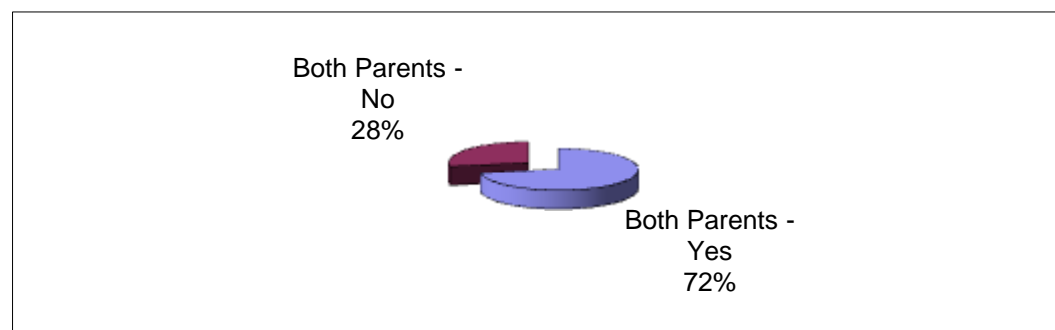
A2 - Number of Siblings under 18

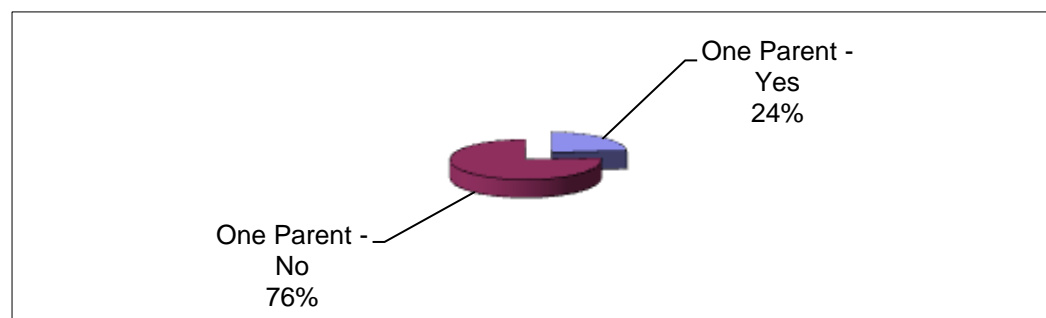
A3 - Living with parents

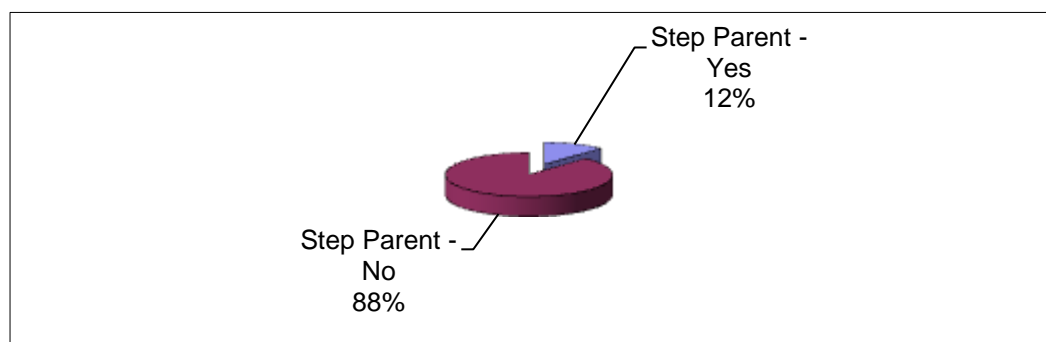
A4 - Living with one parent

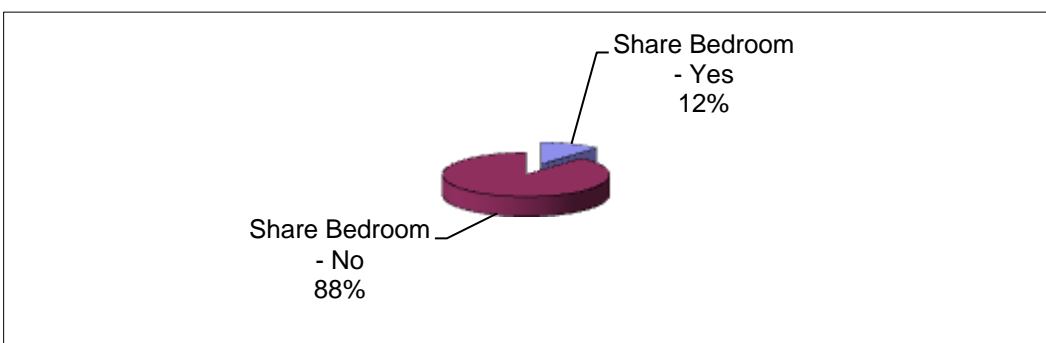
A5 - Living with Step parents

A6 Sharing a bedroom

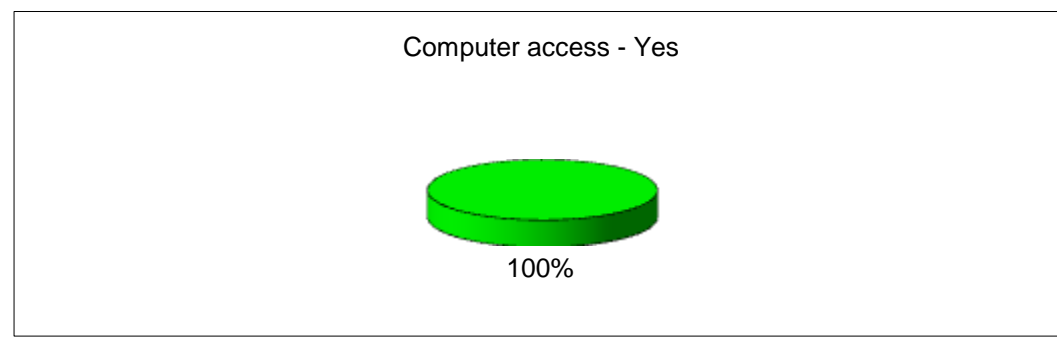

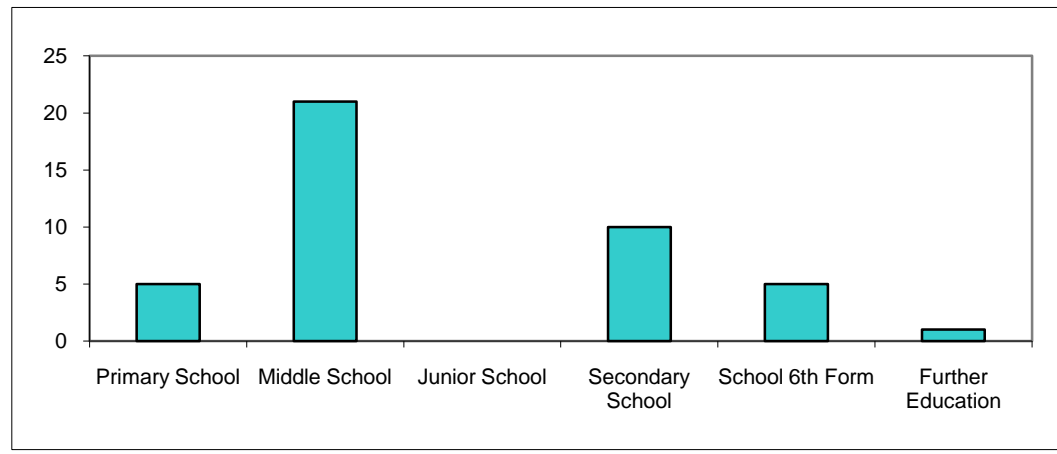

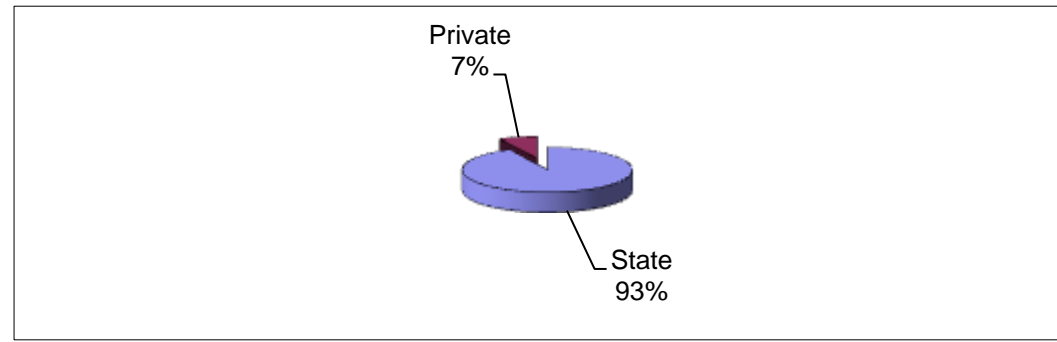

B2 - State or Private Education

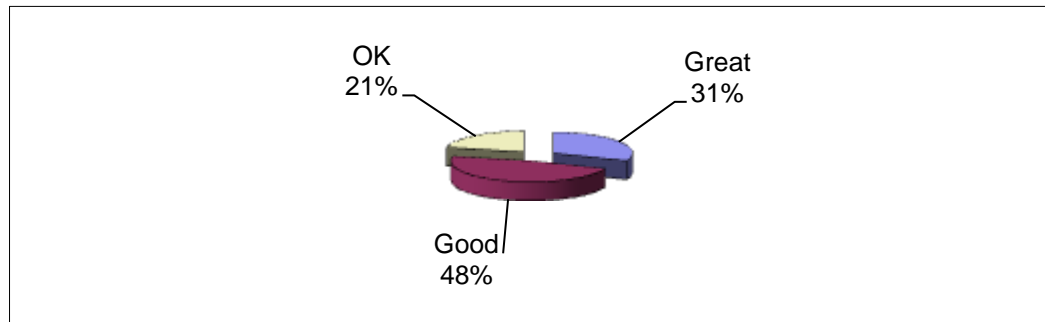

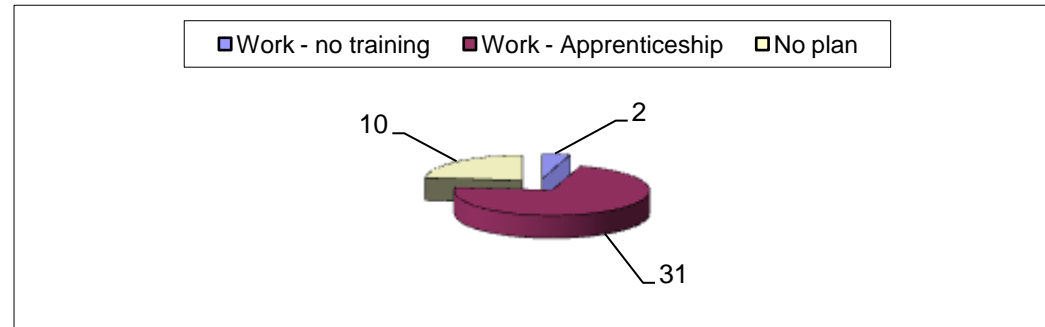


B4 - Feelings about poor standard of education (No Entries)

B5 - Age on leaving education (No Entries)

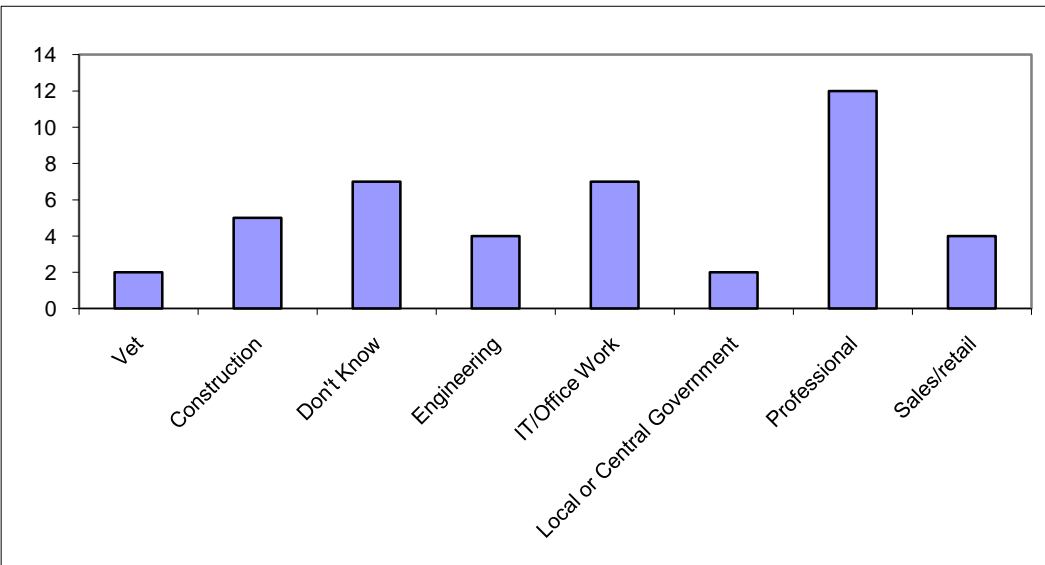

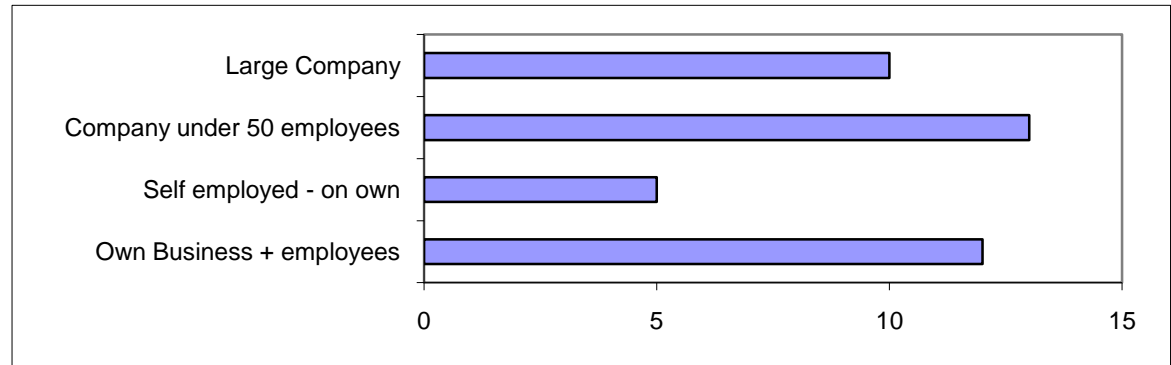

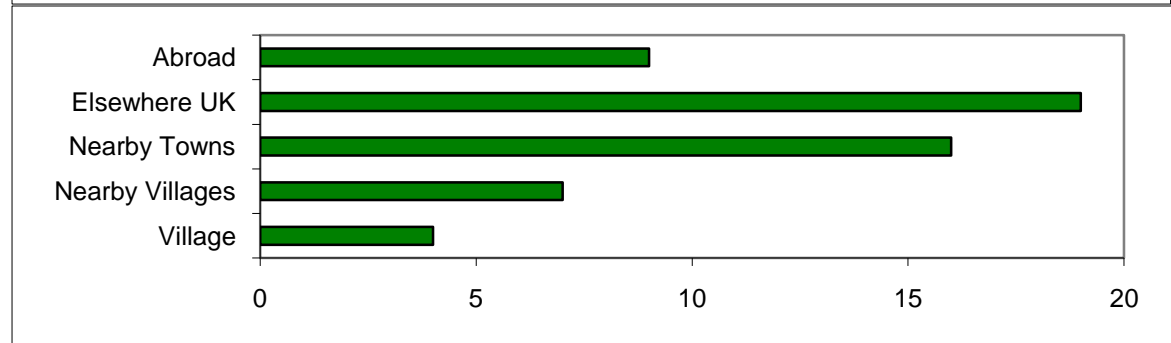
C2 - Preference for working FOR OTHERS or running OWN BUSINESS

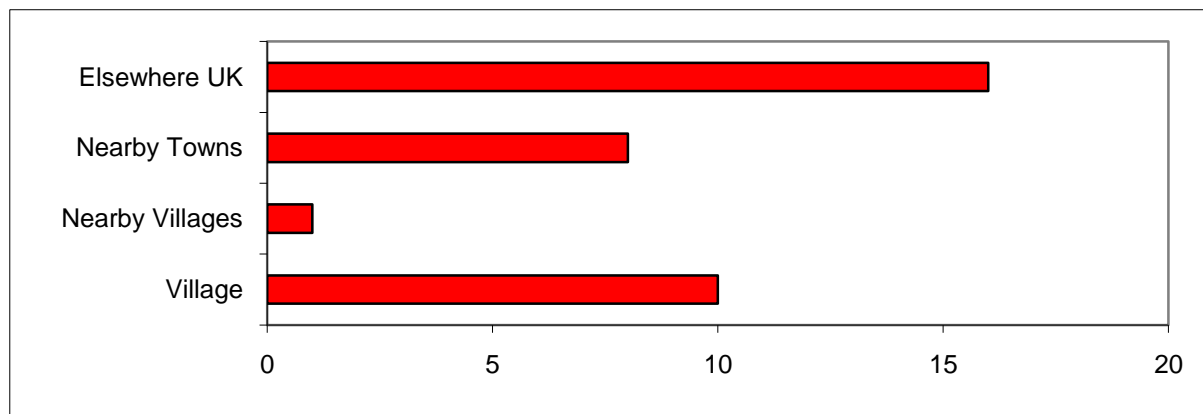
C3 - Preferred location for work place

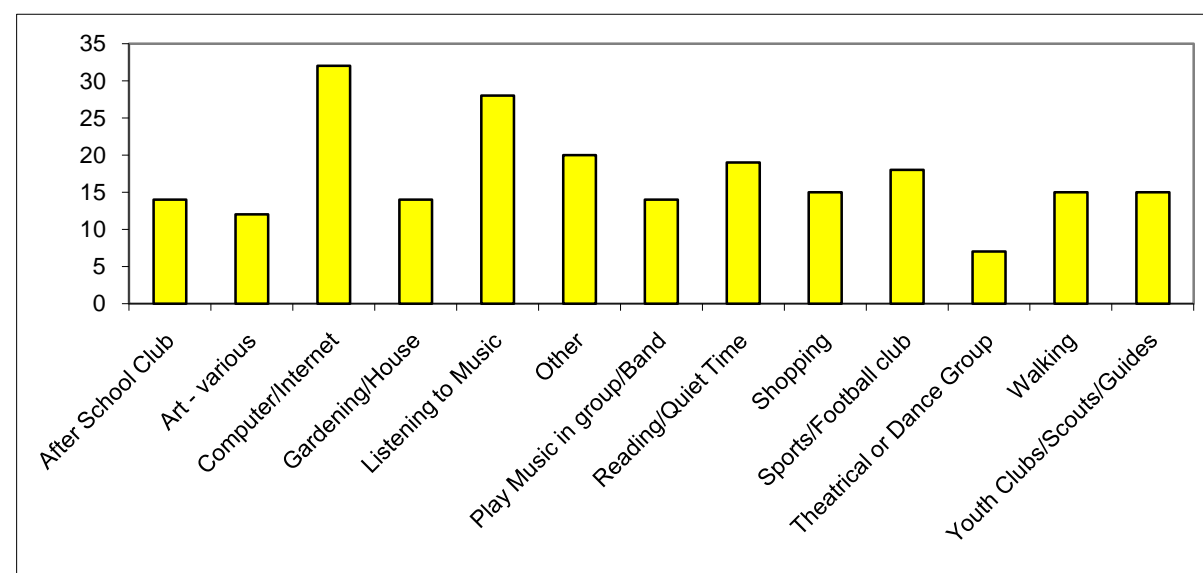

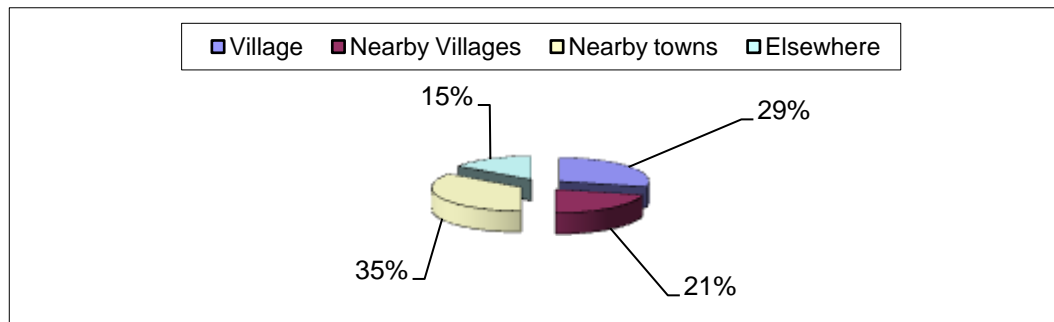

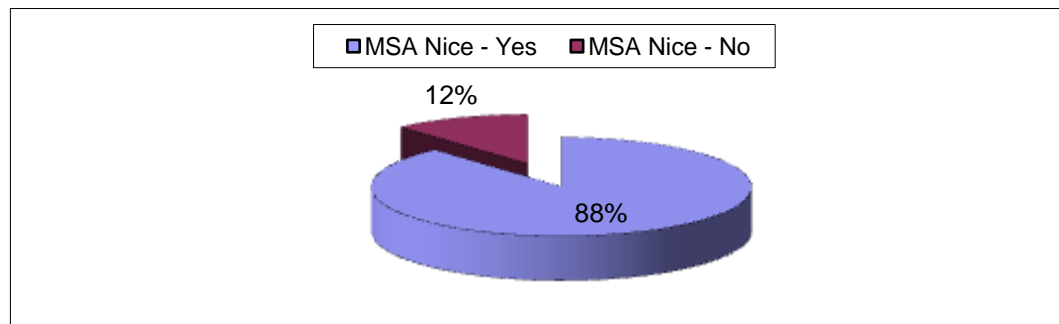
D2 - Where are these activities?

E3 - Reasons for answering "Yes" or "No":

Responses - 34.

No: Six responded that there needed to be more constructive things for teenagers to do. They would like to see a proper meeting place; safer road crossings and cheaper and better bus services.

Yes: Twenty-eight were high in their praise for Milborne: These responses are summarised as follows:

- "It's sweet and small and has big fields and a lovely stream"
- "I've grown up here and its home"
- "It's quiet, peaceful and relaxing; I love the countryside and the wildlife"
- "It does have a park, post office and shop"
- "The people are good and it is a friendly community"
- "It is a safe village, not big and crowded"

E3 - How Milborne might be improved:

Responses 34

These were very thoughtful and most readily achievable.

The majority focussed on "More things to do - especially for older teenagers" Sports facilities were specifically noted with a desire for better soccer goals (at the Village Hall), a better and brighter play park with more activities including a multi-games area and a skate park. They would like to see more clubs for teenagers(Art/craft clubs being mentioned) A youth club for 7-10 year olds was asked for..

They would like to see better transport to nearby towns; a "Pelican or Zebra" crossing on the A354 as well as a "Lollipop Lady"; Street lights were not necessary and there should be no more building development.

On community affairs there should be fewer pompous people on committees, the village should develop into more of a community and the pub should be re-opened.

: ***"No way can it be improved"***

E5 - What Milborne should have in 20 years time that it does not have now:

Thirty respondents confirmed the views at Question E3. The majority of the ideas were again achievable focussing mostly on sports and recreational The pub should have more singers and performers and a night club and leisure centre would be desirable.

In sports facilities a trampoline, tennis courts and basket ball court and potyher ball games would be welcomed. A swimming/paddling pool and a paint ball aread were also on the wish list.

On community matters a "Pelican" crossing was again seen as necessary while a bus shelter and teenagers meeting place were required. Long term facilities listed were a new village hall and development of a food shopping centre since "my Mum has to go out every2 days"

On housing there were two conundrums "Better people to buy the houses" and "for terrace houses to be bigger with bigger gardens".

The opinion was expressed that "Nothing/not much, (needs to be done) its fine as it is" followed by " Too far ahead to think about"

Finally one young person clearly has an entrepreneurial streak hoping for a Zoo in Milborne.
